#### **Senior Warden's Perspective**

##### **A Continuing Time of Transition**

So much has happened in the short time since our last newsletter was published! Perhaps not as exciting in the eyes of the world as seeing a puff of white smoke rising above the Vatican to signal the election of a new pope, but to us the calling of a new rector for St. Andrew's is a welcome and equally important milestone as we journey into the future. The vestry approved a formal resolution in special session on August 21 to call the Reverend Melinda Archer, canonically resident in the Diocese of Dallas, to be the next rector of St. Andrew's. This means the search has ended, the search committee has disbanded, and we move forward with the details of installing Melinda as our new rector. We anticipate her first Sunday with us will be the third Sunday in October, the 16<sup>th</sup>. Thanks be to God!

In addition to all the activity associated with the search and calling of a new rector, we've had a lot of other things going on: a stewardship workshop with Canon Chuck Robertson, *Safeguarding God's Children* training for 14 of our leaders and teachers, *Godly Play* training for a new team of teachers, the finalizing of Sunday School curricula for the coming academic year, conversion of the stage area in the south end of the parish hall into a multi-purpose office to support Spanish Ministry and Christian Education, installation of new doors at the entrance to the church, and progress in the construction of the cellular antenna facility, to name just a few. These things didn't just happen – they were the result of dedicated effort on the part of members of our parish family.

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My special vote of thanks goes out to all of you who have made it possible for St. Andrew's to continue to thrive through the difficult time between rectors – especially the “unsung heroes” behind the scenes, including vestry members, acolytes, altar guild, secretary, hospitality committee, choir, supply clergy, project volunteers, and a plethora of others.

It would be easy to sit back and just let things coast for the six weeks or so until our new rector arrives – and certainly the rest would be well deserved – but there is still much to do. If you have not been actively involved in any of the many ministries at St. Andrew's or as a volunteer, I encourage you to get involved now – don't wait until our new rector arrives. In the letters of Paul to the Romans and the Corinthians (Rom 12:4-8 and 1<sup>st</sup> Cor 12:12-27) we are reminded that although God has given us different gifts, we are like the parts of the body – each essential to the well-being of the whole. We are, in fact, the members of the body of Christ in this place we call St. Andrew's, each with gifts to share with the rest to build up that body. Let our new rector arrive in October to find a vibrant congregation ready to be led along the next phase of our journey of faith together!

**Perspectivo del Guardián Mayor**

**El Tiempo de Transición Continúa**

¡Tanto ha sucedido en el tiempo corto desde que nuestra última revista fue publicada! Quizás no tan significativo en los ojos del mundo como viendo un soplo de humo blanco sobre el Vaticano para señalar la elección de un nuevo papa, pero para nosotros la llamada de una nueva rectora para San Andrés es igualmente importante en nuestra senda al futuro. El vestry aprobó una resolución formal en una sesión especial el 21 de agosto para llamar a La Reverenda Melinda Archer, canónicamente residente en la diócesis de Dallas, para ser la próxima rectora de la Iglesia de San Andrés. Esto significa que la búsqueda ha terminado, el comité de la búsqueda ha disuelto, y nos movemos adelante con los detalles de instalar Melinda como nuestra nueva rectora. Anticipamos que su primer domingo con nosotros será el tercer domingo en octubre, el decimosexto. ¡Gracias a Dios!

Además de toda la actividad asociada con la búsqueda y la llamada de una nueva rectora, han ocurrido muchas otras cosas: un entrenamiento de mayordomía con el Canon Chuck Robertson, entrenamiento sobre *Salvaguardando los Niños de Dios* para 14 de nuestros líderes y maestros, el entrenamiento sobre *Juego de Dios* para un nuevo equipo de maestros, concluida de los planes de estudios de la escuela dominical por el año académico que viene, la conversión de parte de la área en el sur de la sala parroquial en una oficina para educación cristiana y ministerio hispano, la instalación de puertas nuevas en la entrada a la iglesia, y progreso en la construcción de la facilidad de la antena celular, al nombrar apenas algunos. Estas cosas no sucedieron solas - eran el resultado del esfuerzo dedicado de parte de miembros de nuestra familia parroquial. Mi voto especial de las gracias sale a todos ustedes que han hecho posible que San Andrés continuara prosperando durante el tiempo difícil entre rectores - especialmente los "héroes no conocidos" detrás de las escenas, incluyendo miembros del vestry, los acólitos, la cofradía del altar, las secretarías, el comité de hospitalidad, el coro, el clero auxiliar, los voluntarios en proyectos, y una plétora de otros.

Sería fácil sentarnos y hacer poco durante las seis semanas hasta que llega nuestra nueva rectora - y el descanso sería ciertamente bien merecido - pero todavía hay mucho que hacer. Si ustedes no han participado activamente en cualquiera de los muchos ministerios en San Andrés o como voluntario, le animo lo hagan hoy día - no esperen hasta que llega nuestra nueva rectora.

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En las cartas de San Pablo a los Romanos y los Corintios (ROM 12:4-8 y 1COR 12:12-27) nos recuerda que aunque Dios nos ha dado diversos dones, nosotros somos como las partes del cuerpo - cada uno esencial para el bienestar del cuerpo entero. Somos, verdaderamente, los miembros del cuerpo de Cristo en este lugar que llamamos San Andrés, cada uno con dones para compartir con el resto para acrecer ese cuerpo. ¡Deje que nuestra nueva rectora llegue en octubre encontrando a una congregación vibrante lista de ser conducida en la próxima fase de nuestra senda de fe!

**Junior Warden Report**

I walked about the church campus on Sunday and took notice of things taking shape that were merely talked about only weeks and months ago. The cell tower project is nearing completion, the new water fountain in the church, the new doors in the church, new message board on the outside of McNeil hall. All were little projects that were just talked about and now a reality. It is amazing that ideas can turn to reality in such a short time.

But there are things that still need to be done. For instance, there is a small drywall repair job that remains underneath the new water fountain in the church. While it is not noticeable by a simple glance, it still needs to be done. It should not be too big of a job; it's just that someone with drywall skills is needed to finish this project. There needs to be some safety lights installed in McNeil hall. This is to ensure the safety of anyone using the hall in the case of a power outage or a fire. If you have ever been in the hall at night without the lights on, it is very dark except the glow of the exit lights, and those lights really are not enough to prevent anyone from falling over the tables and chairs in the hall. We will need a person with electrical skills to install them to code standards.

But the project that really stands out the most is that of landscaping and one that needs constant attention. This really does not require any real special skills, just your time. We need to keep on top of that project because it makes our campus look beautiful, and keeps our neighbors happy and the city from citing us. Besides, working with a small crew of people on the landscaping makes things go a lot quicker and really a lot of fun.

**"SAFEGUARDING GOD'S CHILDREN"**

On Saturday, August 27<sup>th</sup> 5 Sunday School teachers and 9 vestry and staff members attended the first Safeguarding God's Children training session presented by Canon Earl Gibson at All Saints from 9:00 – 12:00. Safeguarding Gods Children is an official mandatory training program aimed at preventing child sexual abuse. This training program is required by the Diocese of Arizona for all who work with infants, children and youth on a continuing basis. All church school teachers/assistants, Vestry Members, Officers of the Vestry, Clergy, paid staff (church secretary, organist, and sexton) and anyone who works with children 4 or more times a year must attend and be certified.

The training taught us how perpetrators of abuse gain access to children and what keeps children who are abused from telling. We also learned the warning signs to watch for in adults and the different types of violations as well as the warning signs to watch for in children who are in abusive situations and what we can do when we see these warnings. We learned ways to teach our children to protect themselves when their parents aren't around. The training consisted of two parts: the first being for Parents and Congregations and the second for Ministries.

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There will be another session on Saturday, September 24 at Trinity Cathedral from 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM in which everyone who didn't attend the first session should plan on attending. We will be ordering the tapes in both English and Spanish for future training but may not get them for several months so if you are a current teacher you must attend these classes now in order to continue teaching. The Diocese will be auditing our records to confirm we have certificates on file for all who are required to attend these classes.

**SUNDAY SCHOOL BEGINS**

Sunday School is going to look slightly different this year in a few minor ways, due to a lack of teachers to cover individual classes. We have been inspired and led daily by the Holy Spirit (for He is our Helper and Counselor). The students of all ages who attend either the 9:00 or the 12:00 services will be brought together as much as possible for classes held from 10:45-11:45 each Sunday.

A “gathering and singing” for all students will be led by Barbara Fabre in the Parish Hall near the piano, from about 10:30-10:40. Barbara will make this fun by teaching simple Bible songs, singing along with music tapes, or teaching sign language for simple hymns. This will also be the time for students to enjoy a healthy snack before classes, for we will no longer be bringing food into classrooms.

First Communion Class: ages 12-14 will be taught by Enrique Ruiz-Esparza.

After a child has completed First Communion, they will then attend the following classes, depending on age:

Godly Play: ages 3 through 10 will be taught by Lori Cooper and Louise Bowles.

Middle School: ages 11-14 will be taught by Terry Ruth and Maria Guzman.

High School: ages 15 and up will be taught by Jary and Diane Engels.

Room Assignments will be posted in our new Announcement Board on the outside of the Parish Hall near the Office Entrance.

There will be a small one-time fee for Sunday School materials this year, and for offsetting the cost of providing healthy snacks before classes. If not already handled at registration, the teacher will be letting the parents know how to take care of this. If any other member of the church feels so led by the Spirit to make a contribution for Christian Education, we would welcome any amount...and we would also love to have a few adult volunteers to just be with us in our classrooms to observe---this needn't be done on a regular basis unless you wish to do so. Please contact Louise Bowles or Dulce Carmona if you'd like to be an occasional classroom helper.
