St. Andrew's Altar Guild Notes

Maundy Thursday

This is the time in Holy Week in which we place the Reserved , Blessed Sacrament in a repository or on an altar of repose. The altar of repose represents " the Lord in his suffering state – being submitted into human hands and is moving on into his passion and death." The altar is adorned with flowers and candlelight. This is to allow for adoration, prayer and meditation.

Good Friday

The Reserved, Blessed Sacrament has been in the "custody" of the altar of repose. The sacrament is used for the eucharist on Good Friday. The service is held in the sanctuary, with two of the candles brought from the altar of repose.

Holy Saturday

Holy Saturday, the 'day of the entombed Christ,' is the "Lord's day of rest, for on that day Christ's body lay in His tomb. We recall the Apostle's Creed which says, "He descended unto the dead." It is the day of suspense between two worlds, that of darkness, sin and death, and that of the Resurrection and the restoration of the Light of the World. For this reason no divine services are held until the Easter Vigil at night. This day between Good Friday and Easter Day makes present to us the end of one world and the complete newness of the era of salvation inaugurated by the **Resurrection of Christ.**"

The service begins with the first light of Easter. The Paschal Candle is used to light our own candles we carry into the church. The Paschal Candle is "a reminder of the Risen Redeemer "who shining in light left the tomb." This is lit for each service until Ascension Thursday. This is the service which we restore the "Alleluias" into our liturgy. The altar will be adorned with flowers as we celebrate this vigil.

Hospitality Committee

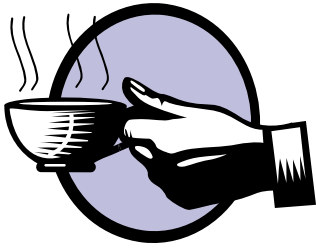

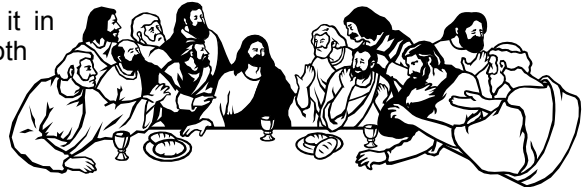
Come join us in the parish hall each Sunday after the 8 a.m. and the 9 a.m. services for good eats and good fellowship
