Dear brothers and sisters,

When you receive this newsletter, we will have just celebrated the marvelous joy of Easter Day and the variety and power of our Holy Week services. We stood with Martha on the way to Lazarus' tomb and heard our Lord's words of comfort to Mary and Martha, to you and to me, and to all humankind: "I am the Resurrection and the Life; he who believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die." (John 11: 25-26)

The whole focus of our walk with Jesus in the Wilderness of Temptation these 40 days of Lent, was intended as a time of preparation. It was a preparation to celebrate Easter with a fuller understanding of the message that Jesus gave to the 2 sisters so long ago. It was also a time for us to echo Martha's response to Him, "I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God...." (John 11:27a). About Being an Episcopalian

Confession

Confession is to the heart as a farmer's pre-planting is to the land. When the farmer prepares the soil before planting seeds, he goes through the field and picks up the rocks, weeds and trash that keep the soil from producing a good crop. When we make our confession, God helps us to remove the rocks and trash that prevent us from having good soil for Him to plant His seeds. These rocks and trash are such things as pride, greed, jealousy or an unkind word about or to someone. This trash needs to be cleaned out so we can have a clean heart for God to plant His seed.

We can make a meaningful corporate confession during the Eucharist or on our own, but sometimes it helps to make one to a priest. Confessing our sins to a priest can help us to come to terms with our sins and forgive ourselves after confessing them. Examination of Conscience is a good way to prepare for confession whether you are doing it privately or to a priest. I am always available for you.

La Confesión

La confesión corresponde al corazón como una preparación de granjero antes de sembrar corresponde al terreno. Cuando el granjero prepara la tierra antes de sembrar las semillas, él atraviesa el campo y recoge las piedras, las hierbas, y basura impiden que la tierra produzca una cosecha Buena. El examen de Conciencia es una manera Buena de prepararse para la confesión si usted lo hace privadamente , o ante un sacerdote. Estoy siempre disponible para cualquiera deseando una confesión privada.

But that's what we've got to do. And when we do—when we're sitting in the shade of a little tree with our iced tea, we'll decide that was and is the best way after all. And why didn't we just do it first of all. God's way is the highway.
